
If an extra profile is mounted under the ring beam (sliding door guide, screen, etc.), water may seep in between this profile and the ring beam.

Prevent this by using sealant or a sealing tape on the outside of the roof.









Brown and black must be connected to their opposing colours in the receiver module!








CONNECTING THE CONNECTOR

An extension cable is used if there is too great a distance between the screen and the radio receiver. Please connect as described below.



Tighten the connector securely.

Danger of electric shock




Never connect the extension cable whilethe power is on! Ensure that the radio receiver is not powered before connections are made or severed.




ELECTRICAL CONNECTION LOUNGE WITH WALL MOUNTING

Install the radio receiver at the bottom in the wall beam. For further instruction purposes, we will assume that it is installed in the left corner.




A Screen under side A.


No extension cable necessary, the screen can be connected directly to the radio receiver,




1 Drill the hole for the screen cable into the groove of the ring beam



2 Enlarge the smallest hole drilled in the rear of the side beam











B Screen under side B.

Use the 5m extension cable so that the screen can be connected in pole 6.











3 Connect the extension cable to the screen cable by using the connector Connect the other side to the radio receive.




C Screen under side C.

Use the 7m extension cable so that the screen can be connected in the wall beam.


























Side C Use the extension cable to connect the screen in pole 4. Extension cable A-98-7082







MOUNTING THE SCREEN



1b Flowzz 100 Remove the roller from the screen casing




- 1. Remove the clip.
- 2. Slide the roller to the left and remove it from the casing.







Work drawings 4 Connect the side guides to the screen 5 Fit both side guides onto the screen casing by using a screw



6 Fasten the screen with screws 50 cm apart. Use the drilled holes to secure the side guides.








8 For the Flowzz 100, put the roller back and, for the Flowzz 115, put the cover back. Slide the screen into the plastic inlays on both sides. It will not be possible to push the screen into the inlays at a later stage.






PROGRAMMING THE REMOTE CONTROL

Depending on the type of remote control, programming can be done in three different ways.


The P1 to P4 function buttons of the radio receiver are used for this. Use P1 to program the screen placed on clamps M1, P2 for M2, etc.



1 BUTTON OPERATION

The screen is operated by a single button on the remote control. In that case, the function sequence of the button is: OPEN > STOP > CLOSE.

- •Briefly press P1..P4 1x (once)
- Press again within one second, but keep pressing until you hear a continuous sound.
- •Keep pressing P1..P4, but now simultaneously with the target button of the remote control.
- •Release both buttons as soon as you hear short beeps. The remote control button is now programmed to operate the screen







2 BUTTON OPERATION

The screen is operated by two buttons on the remote control.

Pressing the button for the first time activates opening (or closes), Pressing the button for the second time activates the stopping of the screen.




7/42 channel remote control possible programming by 2-button operation



2 channel remote control possible programming by 2-button operation


- •Briefly press P1..P4 2x (twice). The interval between pressing the button the first time and pressing it the second time must not be longer than 1 second.
- Press again within one second, but keep pressing until you hear a continuous sound.
- •Keep pressing P1..P4, and press the OPEN button on the remote control.
- •Release both buttons as soon as you hear short beeps. The remote control is now programmed to operate the screen.





3 BUTTON OPERATION


The screen is operated by three buttons on the remote control.

- •Briefly press P1..P4 2x (twice). The interval between pressing the button the first time and pressing it the second time must not be longer than 1 second.
- Press again within one second, but keep pressing until you hear a continuous sound.
- •Keep pressing P1..P4, and press the OPEN button on the remote control.
- •Release both buttons as soon as you hear short beeps. The remote control is now programmed to operate the screen.







'HOLD TO RUN' OPERATION

The screen is operated by two buttons on the remote control. As the name suggests, the screen will continue to move as long as the user actively holds the push button down. The screen will stop as soon as the button is no longer held down or pressed

- •Briefly press P1..P4 3x (three times). The interval between pressing the button the first time and pressing it the second time must not be longer than 1 second.
- Press again within one second, but keep pressing until you hear a continuous sound.
- Keep pressing P1..P4, and press the OPEN button on the remote control.
- •Release both buttons as soon as you hear a short beep. The remote control is now programmed to operate the screen.








DELETING THE CODE

Deleting one code:


Programming method:

- •Briefly press P1..P4 4x (four times). The interval between pressing the button the first time and pressing it the second time must not be longer than 1 second.
- Press again within one second, but keep pressing until you hear a short beep.
- •Keep pressing P1..P4, and simultaneously press the button of the code that you want to delete on the remote control.
- Release both buttons as soon as you hear a continuous sound.



Deleting all codes:

- •Briefly press P1..P4 5x (five times). The interval between pressing the button the first time and pressing it the second time must not be longer than 1 second.
- Press again within one second, but keep pressing for 10 seconds now.
- •You hear short beeps, which turn into a continuous sound. You can now release the button






PROGRAMMING THE END SETTINGS

The motor is delivered in so-called "automatic setting mode". The motor does not have any end positions stored at that moment. The motor will continue to run as long as the up or down button on the remote control is pressed.

Safety features such as obstacle recognition and overload protection will only become active after both end positions have been activated.

The screen will make a short jolting movement every time it moves until the motor is programmed. This will disappear once the end positions have been programmed.

These positions can easily be set by using the Selve adjusting cable.







1 Automatic setting mode:

Top: end point Bottom: end point


Select this setting mode if you want the screen to automatically stop against a mechanical barrier at the top and the bottom. This barrier can be the screen casing, the floor or a stopper that you have installed yourself inside the guides, for example. In the top position, the motor will make a short reversing movement so that the screen cloth will not remain under tension while in a standstill position.


Use the $\uparrow \downarrow$ keys to position the screen somewhere in the middle.






Press ↑ briefly 2x and hold it down afterwards ↑, also after the screen hits the top end point!






After a few seconds, the motor will change direction and the screen will drop until it reaches its lowest end point.



The end positions have now been determined. The settings set can be disconnected and the screen connected to the radio receiver







2 Manual setting mode: Top: you decide for yourself Bottom: you decide for yourself

Choose this method if you want to decide for yourself the top and bottom positions in any random place.


Use the $\uparrow \downarrow$ keys to position the screen somewhere in the middle.





Keep E pressed for at least 6 seconds.




Now keep ↓ pressed down until the desired bottom position has been reached. Confirm by keeping E pressed for at least 3 sec.








Keep ↑ pressed down until the desired top position has been reached. Confirm by keeping E pressed for at least 3 sec.







The end positions have now been determined. The settings set can be disconnected and the screen connected to the radio receiver.



3 Mixed setting mode:

Top: end point


Bottom: you decide for yourself

You combine both the previous principles with this choice. The screen will stop at the top against the screen casing after the setting has been completed. However,


the bottom position can be selected at will.


Use the $\uparrow \downarrow$ keys to position the screen somewhere in the middle.


Push E for at least 6 seconds.




Now keep ↓ pressed down until the desired bottom position has been reached. Confirm by keeping E pressed for at least 3 sec.








Press ↑ briefly 2x and hold it down afterwards 个 until the screen hits the lower end point and stops.






The end positions have now been determined. The settings set can be disconnected and the screen connected to the radio receiver.



4 Reset

Simply press the E key for 1 second to erase the end position settings. The new end positions can be set after that.

WIND SENSOR



The wind sensor is an option that protects the screens from excessive wind. Therefore, install it near the lounge to ensure realistic measurement readings.

If a wind speed is measured as being higher than the set threshold value, the screens go into safety mode:

- •All screens will move up.
- •The LED next to terminals 15 and 16 will flash.
- •The screens will no longer respond to any commands.

The safety mode will only be deactivated if the wind falls back to below the threshold for longer than one minute.

Connect the wind sensor to the radio receiver connector. There is only one connector that fits, so you cannot make a mistake. Use the extension cable provided if necessary.

The default threshold is 40 km/h. This value can be increased to a maximum of 75 km/h by using the DIP switches inside the radio receiver.
